# Preserving the Past, for the Future

**The Family History & Genealogy Center (FHGC)** is the research library of The Danish Immigrant Museum. Since its opening in 1996, the Center has assisted many individuals in the U.S. and Denmark in finding links to their past and to Danish immigrant ancestors and has located lost relatives for Danish and American researchers.

A significant collection of family history resources and background materials relating to Danish immigrants, immigrant settlements and institutions, and Danish Americans may be found at the Center. Assistance is available for both novice genealogists and experienced family historians needing help with Danish research.

The Center is staffed by a full-time librarian and offers translation and research services. The FHGC is a member of the Southwest Iowa Regional Library Services Area and a borrowing library for family history materials available through The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints.
